XV. CONSENT AGENDA

- 1. Approve purchase of one (1) 2021 Ford F-600XL Standard Cab & Chassis with an eleven (11) foot dump bed with a diesel engine from Prater Ford in the amount of \$66,359.68 for the Floyd County Water Department. This was budgeted at \$80,000.00.
- 2. Approve a grant award from the Office of the Governor's Criminal Justice Coordinating Council in the amount of \$221,065.00 from the Floyd County Adult Felony Drug Courts. This will require a \$24,563.00 local match.
- **3.** Approve the surplus of the submitted listed vehicles and equipment submitted by the Floyd County Purchasing Department.
- 4. Approve the annual contract with the Georgia Department of Transportation to sweep the shoulders (bike lanes) on the newest leg of the Bypass (Temp 746) monthly by the Floyd County Public Works Department for \$1,000.00 monthly.
- 5. Approve one (1) vehicle for the Floyd County Coroner's office. This will be an addition to the fleet.
- 6. Approve a grant award from the Office of the Governor's Criminal Justice Coordinating Council in the amount of \$175,386.00 from the Floyd County Mental Health Court. This will require a \$19,487.00 local match.
- 7. Approve Task Order No. 01 for professional services airfield fencing—Phase 2 Construction with Crawford, Murphy, and Tilly.
- 8. Approve ACCG Property and Liability Renewal for 2021-2022.

- 1. Approve the Floyd County Classification and Compensation Plan
- 2. Approve the purchase of ILS 420 Landing Equipment and related items for Richard B. Russell Regional Airport from Thales Air Traffic Management, U.S., in Overland Park, Kansas, in the amount of \$458,958.00. This is budgeted in the 2013 SPLOST.
- **3.** Approve purchase of nine (9) Police Interceptor vehicles for the Floyd County Police Department and Sheriff's Office in the amount of \$337,537.26 (\$37,504.14 each) from Prater Ford. The total price including upfitting for all nine (9) vehicles and cameras for the three (3) police vehicles is \$422,287.26. Six (6) vehicles will be for the Sheriff's Office and three (3) for the Police Department.

This is budgeted in the 2017 SPLOST pending approval of item #3 under New Business.

- **4.** Approve a 2017 SPLOST budget revision in the amount of \$422,287.26.
- **5.** Approve abolishment of two part time parking attendant positions in General Services.
- **6.** Approve creation of one patrol officer position in the Floyd County Police Department to manage parking.
- 7. Approve budget transfer of \$28,564.00 from General Services to Police for salaries and wages, FICA, unemployment compensation, and pension expense.
